**A BILL FOR AN ACT**

Relating to the addition to Oregon Statute 336.900 mandating single sex secondary school classrooms.

**Be it enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

**Section 1 ORS 336.900 is added to chapter 336 of the Oregon Revised Statutes and reads as follows: All publicly funded secondary school classrooms should be made up of only students of one gender.**

**Section 2 Definitions: Gender is defined as the classification a person identifies themselves as, being either male or female. Secondary school is defined as students in the 7<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grades.**

**Section 3 This 2007 act to take effect on January 1, 2009. Schools have 90 days to comply.**
