



## Oregon 4-H Camp Leadership Conference March 30-April 1, 2012

**Dear County 4-H Agent,**

Please make sure that you have a chaperone for every 10 youth. Chaperones need to be an approved 4-H Leader 21 years or older. Counties are encouraged to work together to provide female and male chaperones for their youth. Please provide the county affiliation for each chaperone listed. Participants will be housed by gender starting with the Cottages on a first come first serve basis. Your county registration form must be received along with the code of conduct forms, health forms, and payment for all your listed participants before you will be assigned housing. Once Cottages are full, cabins will be used unless counties request to be housed in a cabin.

### **What to Bring:**

Please bring clothing appropriate for changeable spring weather. It could be raining so waterproof jackets would be a good idea. Participants will be walking to meeting locations.
