



# Oregon 4-H Shotgun Mail-in Tournament

## General Rules

- Oregon 4-H Code of Conduct will be enforced for all shooting events.
- Participants must be enrolled in the 4-H Shotgun Project.
- Participants shoot must for score once each month.
- Participants should have ample time for practice and warm-up, then should complete the round except for a rest period if needed.
- No electronic devices (other than noise canceling earmuffs will be permitted on the range (e.g. cell phones, range finders, iPods).
- The same firearm must be used throughout the tournament, except in the case of malfunction.
- Rounds must be shot during scheduled month and scores submitted electronically or on form 461-02, postmarked by the 5th of the following month to: Todd Williver , Oregon 4-H Shooting Sports, 3893 SW Airport Way, Redmond, OR 97756; or todd.williver@oregonstate.edu. Results and statewide scoring will be sent to participating clubs and Extension 4-H faculty each month.
- Participants will pay a \$5 registration fee to cover the administrative costs associated with the Oregon 4-H Shooting Sports Program. Send registration fee to Oregon Outdoor Education & Recreation to the address listed above.

## Shotgun Specific Rules

- Any gauge of shotgun is permitted, in either semi-automatic, pump or break action (over-under or side-by-side) . Shotguns with higher magazine capacities may only contain two (2) shells at any given time.
- Course of fire is the standard American Trap, from 16 yards.
- For a target to be considered “dead” it must have a visible piece broken from it, or one that is completely reduced to dust. All other targets will be scored as “lost”.
- Challenges must be determined by the discipline judge, superintendent or 4-H Agent at the time of the shoot. Once the scores have been submitted, they may not be challenged.

## Class Number

(boys and girls in same classes)	Grade(s)
1. Shotgun (Jr).....	4,5,6
2. Shotgun (Int).....	7,8,9
3. Shotgun (Sr).....	10, 11, 12

*(Must complete in same class for all three rounds to score).*

## Rounds

February - Singles 25 clays/rounds  
March - Doubles 50 clays/rounds (25 pair)  
April - Singles/Double Combined 75 clays/rounds 25 Singles, 25 pairs - *not from previous scores*

***NOTE - Leaders may choose to shoot April match over two days, to alleviate fatigue for younger members, in desired.***

## Scoring

Shotgun scoring will be the standard American Trap, fired from 16 yards. 25 rounds/clays (singles) and 50 (25 pairs) rounds/clays (doubles).

\*A maximum of 100 additional points will be awarded for safety (50pts) and sportsmanship (50pts). See safety and Sportsmanship scoring guide for more detail.

## Awards

Achievement stickers will be awarded as follows:

Blue	100-85%
Red	84-70%
White	69% and below

## Fee

- \$5 per shooter, no limit on number of classes.
