Must Bring

- \$20 to \$25 to buy your Monday evening meal at a restaurant. (Every group will be supervised.)
- A jacket with a hood (and/or umbrella) for potential rain.
- Comfortable shoes for walking to the Capitol, and to events within about 6 blocks.

Try to Bring Technology

Everyone will be assigned to an *Action Team* to research and plan a presentation for a question asked by an Oregon agency. For easy access and good use of your time, try to bring:

A laptop computer* or Tablet* or Smart Phone* (plus cords labeled with your name*)

(NO WORRIES if you can't bring your own technology. Every Action Team will have access to some technology.)

Want to Bring...?

(A) Snacks, and/or **(B)** your own pillow and blanket to sleep on top of the bed. There are 2 beds per room and 4 teens (of similar ages) will be assigned to each hotel room.

Do NOT Bring

Precious jewelry or game technology that could be lost. There will not be time to use game technology.

Clothing to Bring

See a recommended Dress Code on the Working Agenda for each day of the conference. (You are representing the Oregon 4-H Program and its partners during all hours of this conference.)

Casual Clothing Polo shirts, logo wear (e.g., 4-H), t-shirts (no slogans that may offend others), **kakis, or jeans** (no rips) are OK during workshops and meetings at the Convention Center and hotel.

Professional Clothing Shirts with collars, dress slacks, jackets, ties, suits, or dresses/skirts are most appropriate clothing for time at the Capitol Building, meeting decision-makers, and delivering the group presentation to state agency representatives.

Active Wear The hotel **swimming pool** will be available. (Choose a conservative suit.) And there may be time for early morning **walks or runs** with an adult supervisor.
